HOW TO WRITE A COMPETITIVE PROPOSAL?

The interactive workshop will be focused on proposal writing. To provide you with more time for preparation of a competitive proposal the workshop will be divided into two subsequent parts - **first part will be held on 11 and 12 June 2018** and will consist of two-day intensive training in ERC proposal writing. Together with an experienced ERC evaluator we will discuss in detail your CV, abstract of your proposal as well as evaluation criteria and essential components of a competitive ERC proposal. Afterwards you will have a unique opportunity to work with a successful ERC project from the field of social sciences and humanities or life sciences (depending on your choice), to meet its principal investigator and to play the role of an evaluator in order to understand what should be stressed in a real proposal.

The second part of the workshop will be held on 21 September 2018 and will consist of individual presentations of the applicants' ideas and a discussion with other participants, experienced ERC grant holders and ERC evaluators from the applicants' fields of research.

To maximize the impact and effectiveness, the workshop is opened only for ERC Starting/Consolidator (eventually also Advanced) grant applicants who already work on a grant proposal, which they intend to submit to the 2019 ERC Work Programme calls.

To attend the workshop the applicants are required to send a CV (max. 2 pages), a short abstract of the proposal (max. 2000 characters) and their early achievements track-record (max. 2 pages) in one file and according to the instructions in the <u>Information for Applicants to the Starting and Consolidator Grant 2018 Calls</u> (using the ERC template)¹ to Ms Z. Dvorakova (<u>dvorakovaz@tc.cz</u>) till 27 May 2018 at the latest. We kindly ask you to register as soon as possible, even if you have not yet finalised the materials requested.

All materials will be considered as confidential. The quality of the received materials will be decisive for confirmation of the participation at the workshop. Registration will be confirmed no later than 7 June 2018.
